- In 2015 world leaders adopted 17 SDGs
- Key achievements of MDGs:
 - ✓ More than 1 billion people have been lifted from extreme poverty since 1990;
 - ✓ Child mortality has dropped by more than half since 1990;
 - ✓ Number of out-of-school children dropped by more than half since 1990;
 - ✓ Primary school enrolment rate reached 91% in 2015
 - ✓ Literacy rate among youth aged 15-24 increased from 83% to 91% between 1990 and 2015

I Part - Moving from unfinished MDGs towards universal SDGs

- Shortfalls of MDGs:

- ✓ Uneven progress across regions and countries
- ✓ Marginalized, disadvantaged and vulnerable people left behind
- ✓ Persistent gender inequality
- ✓ About 800 million people still live in extreme poverty
- ✓ Some 57 million, children of primary school age are out of school




