Dr. Ethel Agnes Pascua-Valenzuela is an Education Advisor to ASEAN on the Future of Education in the ASEAN Socio Cultural Community Research and Development Platform. She recently completed her 4-year term as the director of the Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization (SEAMEO) Secretariat, becoming the first women to hold the position since the organization was founded in 1965. During her administration, she implemented a range of educational improvement and research projects across the region, such as the SEA PLM, the first ever regional assessment in ASEAN, SEAMEO Centre Policy Research Network (CPRN), and the SEAMEO MOOCS Network. She has worked closely with Ministers of Education, international organizations, and other regional NGOs and led the COVID-19 responses from SEAMEO at the height of the pandemic reaching over 4.5 Million teachers in Southeast Asia and beyond. In particular, Dr. Pascua-Valenzuela sits on the UNESCO COVID-19 Global Coalition for COVID-19 response, UNESCO Education 2030 High Level Steering Committee, a governing board member of the UNESCO Institute of Lifelong Learning (UIL) and UNESCO Institute of Statistics (UIS). As a passionate educator, she teaches PhD classes at the College of Education, University of the Philippines Diliman Campus online. She holds an MA in science education from Philippine Normal University and a doctorate from <u>De La Salle University</u>.
